

Reflection for April 20th Easter Sunday

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today, we gather to celebrate the greatest event in human history: the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is the day of victory—the day when sin was conquered, death was defeated, and eternal life was opened to all who believe in Him. The empty tomb is not just a relic of the past; it is a sign of hope, a declaration that the world is forever changed.

In today's Gospel, we witness the powerful moment when Mary Magdalene arrives at the tomb while it is still dark. She finds the stone rolled away and rushes to tell Peter and John. When they arrive, they see the burial cloths but do not yet understand. This moment of discovery is profound. The empty tomb is more than proof of Christ's resurrection—it is an invitation to faith. It is a summons to believe that, in Christ, darkness gives way to light, despair is overcome by hope, and death is swallowed up in victory. Saint Paul, in the second reading, exhorts us: "If you have been raised with Christ, seek what is above." Easter is not just an event of history; it is a living reality that calls us to transformation. The resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our faith and the source of our renewal. Consider the Apostles before and after the resurrection. Before, they were afraid, hiding behind locked doors. But after encountering the risen Christ, they became fearless witnesses, willing to suffer and die for the Gospel. What changed? They encountered the living Jesus, and His victory became their own. We, too. are called to leave behind our own "tombs"—the tombs of sin, fear, and doubt-and step into the new life Christ offers. Look at the saints who lived this Easter faith:

St. Mary Magdalene, once lost in sin, became the first to proclaim the risen Christ. St. Peter, who denied Him, was restored and became the rock of the Church. St. Paul, a persecutor of Christians, was transformed into one of history's greatest missionaries. Their lives changed because they encountered the risen Lord. And so must ours. The world is filled with uncertainty, but Easter reminds us that Christ has conquered all things. When we face trials, we must remember: the same Jesus who triumphed over the grave walks with us. The resurrection calls us to conversion—to turn away from sin and live in the light of

His love. This means forgiving those who hurt us, serving those in need, and choosing holiness over comfort. Easter is a season of joy! Even in the midst of suffering, we are called to radiate the peace of Christ, knowing that we are destined for eternal life. Today, Jesus stands before each of us, just as He stood before Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the Apostles. He calls us to believe, to embrace His victory, and to live as children of the resurrection. So let us leave this Mass not as people burdened by the past, but as men and women renewed by the power of Christ's triumph. May God Bless you now and always. Happy and Blessed Easter.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY is a day of unparalleled grace, where Jesus promises that those who receive Holy Communion with trust in His mercy will receive "complete forgiveness of sins and punishment"—a grace similar to that of baptism. To prepare for this, the faithful are encouraged to go to Confession beforehand to ensure they receive the Eucharist in a state of grace.

However, if someone is unable to go to Confession before receiving Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday, they should go as soon as possible afterward. The key is to approach Communion with sincere repentance and trust in God's mercy, resolving to make a good Confession at the next available opportunity. While the Church teaches that one should not receive Communion in a state of mortal sin, those who are unaware of any grave sin or are unable to get to confession beforehand, may receive and then fulfill the Confession requirement soon after.

This reflects the heart of Divine Mercy—God's overwhelming desire to forgive and renew souls. He does not set up impossible barriers but instead invites everyone to trust in His mercy and seek His grace with sincerity.
