



On behalf of the Church of Holy Trinity and St. Michael's, I want to extend my condolences. No matter the circumstances, the death of a loved one comes as a shock. I hope that you feel the love and support of family and friends during this difficult time.

The purpose of this letter is to answer a few questions about the funeral liturgy. There are undoubtedly many decisions yet to be made.

The Funeral Liturgy:

The Funeral Liturgy is an ancient ritual that expresses the fundamental Christian belief in the Resurrection and eternal life. It consists of three main parts: The Vigil or Wake, the Mass and the Committal.

The Wake is a time for us to reflect on the person's past life. This is an opportunity for people to console each other and recall the impact the deceased had on them. It is also a fitting time to offer words of remembrance or a eulogy. I also make myself available for anyone who would like to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Sometimes people have been away from Church and would like to receive Holy Communion at the Funeral Mass. Please do not hesitate to ask me when I come to lead prayers at the Wake.

The Funeral Mass is the principal part of the Funeral Liturgy. At the Mass, we offer worship, praise and thanksgiving to God for the gift of life which has now been returned to God" (OCF, No. 5). We turn our gaze from death to the promise of eternal life. In our current state of grieving we face the Lord who is the Resurrection and the Life. You will see and hear many symbols at the Mass, holy water, incense, Paschal Candle, music, bells all of which help us to encounter our Risen Lord. Scripture and music are also very integral parts of the Funeral Mass. The Liturgy of the Word at funerals follows the same pattern of a weekend Mass. We welcome family members and friends of the deceased to choose the readings and also to proclaim them.

Finally, at the **Committal** or burial we entrust our loved one to the earth. We bless the grave and ask the Lord to watch over them while they rest in peace awaiting the Resurrection of the Body.

Eulogies: At Holy Trinity Church and St. Michael's eulogies are typically given right before the start of Mass. In keeping with the policies of the Diocese of Albany, one person may offer a brief (2-3 minutes) Eulogy. If the Eulogy is to be given at church, it should be spiritual in nature and appropriate for a Church setting.

Fees: As the priest, I do not get paid for funerals, nor do I expect to be. I am honored to celebrate the funeral of your loved one. All expenses for the funeral Mass are handled by the funeral director.

I hope this information has helped to answer some of your questions regarding the funeral Liturgy. Again, please do not hesitate to contact me if you have further questions. Know that I, along with the parish community, will keep you and your loved ones in my prayers.

He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." The Word of the Lord. 2. Acts of the Apostles 10:34-43 (Long version) A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Peter proceeded to speak, saying: "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality, rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him. You know the word that he sent to the children of Israel as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the Devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. The Word of the Lord. 4. Romans 5:17-21 A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans Brothers and sisters: If, by the transgression of one person, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one person Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all. For just as through the disobedience of one person the many were made sinners, so

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans
For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the
glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ (Jesus) who died, rather, was raised, who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

9. Romans 14:7-9. 10-12
A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans
None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of God; for it is written: "As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall give praise to God." So (then) each of us shall give an account of himself (to God).

10. Corinthians 13:1-13
A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians
If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians			
Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead came also through a man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the Kingdom to his God and Father. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for "he subjected everything under his feet." But when it says that everything has been subjected, it is clear that it excludes the one who subjected everything to him. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality. And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: "Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.
